1. The Security Council held informal consultations this afternoon to discuss the Secretary-General's report on UNAMIR and subsequent action. France introduced a draft letter to be addressed by the President of the Security Council to the Secretary-General and a draft resolution to be adopted by the Council. Both are attached for your information.
2. During the discussions on both the substance of the report and the action to be taken by the Council, the Nigerian representative requested Rwanda who, as you are aware, was elected a non-permanent member of the Council for 94-95, to provide information regarding the delay in the installation of the BBTG. The Ambassador of Rwanda did not provide any new element though he assured that an agreement among the parties would be reached shortly.
3. All members of the Council supported the SG's recommendation that UNAMIR should continue to implement its mandate and that the second battalion be deployed in the DMZ. However, they expressed concern that the BBTG has not yet been established. The Members of the Council also stressed the need for the parties to cooperate fully in the implementation of the Arusha agreements.
3. The USA representative requested additional information on the activities of the "well armed and reportedly ruthless group"

The members of the Security Council have taken note of your report on the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (UNAMIR) of 30 December 1993 (S/26927), on the basis of which they have completed the review provided for in paragraph 2 of resolution 872 (1993).

The members of the Security Council take this opportunity to inform you that they agree with your conclusion that progress has been made towards the implementation of the Arusha Peace Agreement.

Reaffirming its resolution 872 (1993) of 5 October 1993 establishing the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (UNAMIR),

Recalling its resolutions 812 (1993) of 12 March 1993, 846 (1993) of 6 June 1993 and 891 (1993) of 20 December 1993,

Having examined the report of the Secretary-General of 30 December 1993 (S/26927), as well as his previous report of 24 September 1993 (S/26488 and Add.1),

Taking note of the progress made in implementing the Arusha Peace Agreement,

Welcoming the valuable contribution to peace made so far in Rwanda by the United Nations Assistance Mission for Rwanda (UNAMIR),

Noting with concern the outbreaks of violence in Rwanda and the consequences for Rwanda of the situation in Burundi, and calling on all in the region to rededicate themselves to peace,

Keeping in mind the joint statement made by the parties in Kibeho on 2 December 1993 towards the implementation of the Arusha Peace Agreement, and in particular the constitution of a broad-based transitional Government,

Paying tribute to the role played by the Organization of African Unity (OAU) in the implementation of resolution 872 (1993),

1. Reaffirms its approval of the Secretary-General's recommendation to proceed with the implementation plan for UNAMIR as outlined in the report (S/26488 and Add.1), including the early deployment of the second battalion to the demilitarized zone as recommended in paragraph 30 of the last report (S/26927);

2. Strongly urges the parties to continue to cooperate fully in order to establish a broad-based transitional Government at the earliest in conformance with the Arusha Peace Agreement and the schedule of the Secretary-General contained in his report of 24 September 1993 (S/26488 and Add.1);

3. Welcomes the efforts by the Secretary-General and his Special Representative to help promote and enhance a dialogue;

4. Welcomes also the efforts of Member States, United Nations agencies and non-governmental organizations which have provided economic, financial, military and humanitarian assistance and urges others to provide such assistance;
