Dear Mr Ollivier

We intend to publish a book dealing with the murders of ANC representative Ms Dulcie September in 1988 in France, of SWAPO leader Mr Anton Lubowski in Windhoek in 1989, and of SACP leader Mr Chris Hani in 1993.

The book makes mention of you in some paragraphs. As we are eager to avoid any accusation of slander or defamation to anybody's character, we would like to take this opportunity to make you aware of the content of these paragraphs and invite you to comment on them.

## It is mentioned that:

- You played an important role in the Operation Condor negotiations between South Africa, France, the Netherlands and Angola in 1987
- Your role was based on the fact that you have business interests in the Southern African area
- These business interests include minerals as well as a representative role for the arms company then called Thomson CSF
- Arms and minerals deals were an important by-product of Operation Condor
- You, as a middleman for French interests, helped to organise arms deals involving both the
   Angolan and the South African governments during that time when the two countries were at war with one another











- Dulcie September, who investigated sanctions-busting and arms trade with South Africa at the time, was a threat to these deals
- She was also a threat to more general French interests around Operation Condor (i.e. France's positioning of itself as a friend of the ANC and the new South Africa)
- You as a representative of both national French interests and a key person representing the
  mineral and arms interests of the French business elite commonly referred to as the
  'Francafrique', would have recognised this threat
- You command many good contacts in the French secret services
- You maintained and possibly maintain close contact with the group commonly associated with the murder of Dulcie September, namely the French Comoros-based mercenaries
- This group has been involved in many murders and murderous operations
- You are a close associate of 'ex-Comorien' Mr Alain Guenon
